Edith Beckman Krohn, 98, passed away in her sleep on Sunday, October 30, 2011 at her home in Brighton Gardens, Rockville, MD, after having lived her life to the fullest. She was the wife of the late Dr. Harold Krohn, who was the love of her life.

She was born in Philadelphia on June 23, 1912, daughter of the late Morris and Pauline Goldman Beckman.

She was educated at the University of Pennsylvania and became a clinical psychologist, practicing at the Harrisburg State Hospital for 42 years. She was instrumental in starting the Lebanon County Mental Health & Mental Retardation Association, was a founder of the Lebanon Community Concert series and the Valley Beach Club pool and golf course. She was widely recognized for her work and was a recipient of the Founders Day Award from Lebanon Valley College. Together with her late husband they were active in many facets of community life in Lebanon, especially the community of friends at Beth Israel Synagogue.
