Frank Scheingraber of Manheim Township passed away on September 8, 2025, 4 days shy of his 90th birthday at Hospice & Community Care, Mount Joy. Born in Lancaster on September 12, 1935, he was the son of the late Frank and Philomena Scheingraber. Frank was the husband of Helen Kirchner Foresman-Scheingraber with whom he just celebrated 48 years of marriage with on August 26th.

Born and raised on Cabbage Hill, he attended St. Joseph's Catholic Church earlier in his life. He graduated from Lancaster Catholic High School in 1953. He was proud of his German Heritage and was a life member of the Lancaster Liederkrantz and an honorary member of the Alpenrose Schuhplattlers, which he was a founding member of the original Liederkrantz Dancers in 1958.

Frank was a meat cutter all his life. He worked for over 35 years for Kunzler. He had also worked for former Goodhart's Butcher Shop in Conestoga and former Darrenkamp's Markets in Willow Street and Mount Joy.
