George G. Seibert, 80, of Elizabethtown, formerly of Lebanon and Gretna Springs passed away Tuesday morning, April 29, 2014 at Hershey Medical Center after a lengthy illness. Born on December 4, 1933 in Marion Twp., Berks County, he was the son of the late Selas H. and Iva C. Wolfe Seibert. He was the husband of Sara Ann Bucher Seibert whom he married on January 8, 1956.

George graduated from Bethel High School, Berks County where he played soccer and baseball. After graduation he enlisted in the United States Air Force in 1953 where he served over 21 years retiring as Chief Master Sergeant in 1974. During his enlistment George was Aircraft Maintenance Superintendent. He served as Non Commissioned Officer in Charge of Aircraft Maintenance during the evacuation of Hanoi Hilton Prisoners of War during the Vietnam War. Among his many awards, George received Meritorious Service Medal, Airman's Commendation Medal, Air Force Good Conduct Medal, Army Good Conduct Medal, Expert Rifleman's Medal, National Defense Medal, Philippines Outstanding Unit Award, along with several Air Force Longevity Awards.

After retiring from the Air Force, George worked in Civil Service at New Cumberland for 20 years as Quality Control Inspector. He retired from that position in 1995. Following that retirement, George continued to work at the Manheim Auto Auction. George was also a Licensed Barber and enjoyed sharing his time in that occupation. He was licensed to barber in the states of

Pennsylvania, New Jersey and Oklahoma.

George was very active and proud of his Masonic Affiliations. He received his 50 year Membership Pin from Pyramid #92 F&AM, New Egypt, New Jersey in 2011. He was very active and respected in the Order of Amaranth in which he served as Past Royal Patron and current Secretary of Victory Court #149, Elizabethtown. He was Past Grand Royal Patron of the Grand Court of Pennsylvania, Order of Amaranth and Past Supreme Royal Patron of the Supreme Council, Order of Amaranth, Inc. George also served as Past Worthy Patron of Lebanon Chapter #115, Order of Eastern Star. He was a member of National Sojourners, a Masonic Veterans Group.

George was a member of the Annville VFW #8023 and a member of Honorable Order of Kentucky Colonels. He was a member of Cornwall United Methodist Church. He enjoyed waterskiing, skeet shooting, avid soccer and football fan. George was known for his sense of humor.

He loved his family and supported his wife, daughters and granddaughters in all their life's goals. His wish was for his daughters to be successful and self sufficient and was so proud they were able to fulfill that for him.

In addition to his wife Sara Ann of Elizabethtown, George is survived by his daughters, Amanda S., wife of Peter J. Lisowski of S. Windsor, CT and Emily S., wife of Allen D. Moyer of Elizabethtown. His granddaughters that survive are Elizabeth V. and Virginia A. Moyer, both of Elizabethtown. Two sisters surviving are Shirley Ross of Thousand Oaks, CA and Jean Cummings, wife of Reginald of Bethel, PA. He was preceded in death by a brother, Selas H. Seibert, Jr. and sisters, Marlene Seibert and Ruth Butt.
