Georgia Mae Graver, 78 of Willow Street passed away unexpectedly at home on Thursday evening, October 24, 2024. Born in Lancaster on January 19, 1946, she was the daughter of the late Amos F., Sr. and Marguarite Montgomery Frey. She was the wife of Richard L. Graver, who preceded her in death on March 29, 2012.
