Henrietta L. "Henri" Steiner, 78, Lebanon, passed away Sunday, December 14, 2014 at the Good Samaritan Hospital. She was the wife of the late Richard L. Steiner who passed away August of 1991. Born in Jackson Twp., Lebanon Co., on November 25, 1936, she was the daughter of the late Henry and Lena Reed Fetter.

Henri was a graduate of South Lebanon High School. She was retired from Crestview Answering Service, Lebanon.
