“ I am saddened to read of John's death. I waited too long to find him in my adult life and tell him how much I respected him. From the ages of eleven to eighteen years old, I knew John as the Webelos leader of Cub Scout Pack 443 and as an assistant scoutmaster of Troop 443 of Lebanon, PA. I always thought it a little strange that a man who struck me as so intelligent, clever, and yes, wise, found fulfillment as a millwright, but was impressed with him as one of the brightest minds I have met in my life, counting him among positive influences that have included many a university professor. I fondly recall him bringing Rubik's cubes and other mentally challenging puzzles to scout meetings, losing in chess to him, and being introduced to the wonderful voice of Canadian folk singer Stan Rogers by him. I could tell that he was fond of me and I appreciated his words of wisdom. He towered over my small self as a gentle giant, but I was always happy to be in his company. Listening to a Stan Rogers song many years later motivated me to locate him today. As soon as I saw his photo on this website, I was crushed to recognize his thoughtful eyes staring back at me on an obituary page, beared, grayer, and balder than the youthful version of Abe Lincoln that I remembered, a bittersweet sight that combined my fond memories of him and the sadness that I won't get the chance to shake his hand and tell him just how much I thought of him while catching up with what we had both been up to in the following 30+ years. I certainly didn't know him as intimately as his family members or likely the close friends he formed during the decades between our last meeting, but from what I could observe as an adolescent, I viewed him as someone who epitomized the Greek ideal of a sound mind in a sound body aspiring (successfully) to be an enlightened and virtuous human being.
