.Lamar Lee Lindenmuth, age 67, died on October 9, 2014 at Spang Crest Manor in Lebanon after a 25 year battle with Parkinson's Disease. He was born in Danville PA on February 17, 1947, son of Helen Hand Lindenmuth and the late Lamar Leroy Lindenmuth. In addition to his mother, he is survived by a son, James Todd Lindenmuth (Tammy) of Midland TX; two grandchildren, Theron (Kiplyn) and Natasha; two sisters, Jane Lindenmuth of Hershey and Judith Cassel (James) of Mt. Gretna; three nephews and their families; an uncle, Colonel (Ret) John Hand of Hershey and a favorite cousin, Robert Jackle (Beth) of North Carolina.

Lee graduated from Hershey High School in 1965 and Penn State University in 1969 with a degree in Petroleum and Natural Gas Engineering. He enjoyed a highly successful career that included drilling oil and gas wells in Europe, South America, the Middle East and the United States, and he received national acclaim for the development of innovative drilling techniques. He was also an avid Penn State and Philadelphia sports fan.
