



Raymond Bleecher Huber

June 1, 1930 - May 5, 2016

Raymond Bleecher Huber of Avon Park, FL and Conestoga, PA passed away on Thursday evening, May 5, 2016 at Arbor View at Willow Valley.

Born on June 1, 1930 in West Willow, Ray was the son of the late Lester Martin and Barbara Catherine Bleecher Huber.

Ray was active in Boy Scouts as a boy and was honored to be the first scout in Troup 58, Willow Street to attain Eagle Scout rank. Following graduation from Penn Manor High School in 1947, he began employment at Armstrong Cork Company, but he enlisted in the United States Marine Corps within a year. He served with the First Marine Division in Korea as a tank Commander and participated in the Chosin campaign.

Ray returned to state side duty as a Tech Sergeant in Washington, D.C., where he stood guard for President Harry Truman and was leader of the escort platoon at Arlington National Cemetery. In October of 1951, he met his future bride, Anna Mae Louise Schulte, an FBI employee, through mutual friends who arranged a blind date. Ray and Annie married in May of 1954 and built their home in Willow Street. Ray resumed his career at Armstrong Research and Development, retiring in 1985 as a Senior Research Technician.

Ray was a lifetime member of West Willow United Methodist Church, West Willow Fire Company, and the Marine Corps Tankers Association. His interests included woodworking, hunting, traveling, his Conestoga "woods", and community service.

Along with his wife, Annie; his children, Brian Ray Huber, Marathon, FL and Rae Ann Marie, wife of Donald Henry, Conestoga, and a beloved granddaughter, Alyssa Marie Henry, Muncy, PA and several nieces and nephews, survive him. His sister, M. Jane Huber Martin preceded him in death.
