Raymond N. Pringle, 90 of Lancaster, PA entered his eternal rest on Thursday, June 19, 2014 at home following a brief illness. Born in Bird In Hand, he was the son of the late Arthur A . Pringle & Minnie E Stutzman Stoltzfus. Ray moved back to Lancaster from Louisiana when his beloved soul mate Mary L Lachney passed in October, 2011.

Ray was a veteran, who proudly served 5 years in the US Army 5th Infantry 71st Division in Germany during World War II. Early in his career he was a Chief Electrician for Penn Dairies. He was the owner of Pringles General Store in Colemanville, from 1960 till Hurricane Agnes in 1972, then returning to electrical work locally at the Host Farms. When he moved to Louisiana, he worked for Brown & Root Construction. Ray was a 32nd degree Mason, a member of Shriners International and the American Legion. Ray was best known for his incredible memory, his positive attitude, creative sense of humor and his love of children & ice cream. He enjoyed boating, fishing, making furniture, music, dancing, sun sets, and was especially fond of two cats Silly Ray and Smokey Jo Lane. He loved being with his PA family & friends, soaking up the beaches at Bethany & Rehoboth, camping at Tucquan Family Campground, going to dance recitals & listening to baseball stories.

Bonham, Lancaster with whom he lived.
