RICHARD LEE HERR STILL LIVES; BUT THE BODY THAT HAD FAITHFULLY CARRIED HIM THROUGH THIS WORLD FOR 60 YEARS AND 9 MONTHS DOES NOT. THAT BODY HAD COMPLETED ITS TASK, AND AT THE PRECISE MOMENT APPOINTED AHEAD OF TIME BY GOD HIMSELF, CEASED WORKING ON JANUARY 28, 2014, AT DOCTORS MEMORIAL HOSPITAL, PERRY, FL.

RICK WAS BORN ON APRIL 24, 1953 IN LANCASTER, PA, SON OF THE LATE JOSEPH W. HERR AND PATSY J. HERR OF LANCASTER. HE WAS THE HUSBAND OF DENISE RUBINCAN HERR, WITH WHOM HE CELEBRATED 39 YEARS OF MARRIAGE ON NOVEMBER 23, 2013.

RICK AND DENISE MOVED TO PERRY, FL. FROM LANCASTER IN 1987. THEY OWNED AND OPERATED SUBWAY SANDWICH SHOPS IN PERRY, FL FOR THE PAST 23 YEARS. RICK ENJOYED PLAYING GOLF AS OFTEN AS POSSIBLE, BUT LIVED TO PLAY THE DRUMS, PLAYING ON THE WORSHIP TEAM AT FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH IN PERRY.

IN ADDITION TO HIS WIFE AND MOTHER, RICK IS SURVIVED BY SON STEPHEN B. HERR, WHO HAS BEEN A BLESSING TO THEM AND SISTERS, LISA SHAW OF PERRY, FL, LINDA CREASY AND GINA SMITH, BOTH OF LANCASTER.
