



## Theresa C. Huber

Theresa C. Huber, 78, of Martic Township passed away peacefully at home surrounded by her loved ones. Born on August 27, 1945 in Lancaster, she was the eldest child of the late Richard M. and Carol Dean Owen Huber.

Theresa graduated from Penn Manor High School in 1963. She furthered her education at Indiana University of Pennsylvania, graduating in 1968 with a BS in Education and Hotel Management. Theresa obtained her Masters degree in Man & Environment Relations from Penn State.
